

AP 250.1: Tobacco and Electronic Smoking Devices

The District encourages a safe and healthy learning and teaching environment. The District is committed to its responsibility of enforcing a smoking (tobacco)- and vaping (vapour products)- free environment, as required under the *Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Act*.

In accordance with section 2.2 of the *Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Act*, the use of tobacco and vapour products is banned on all public Kindergarten to Grade 12 school property in British Columbia. A person must not smoke or use tobacco and/or e-cigarettes or hold lighted tobacco and/or activated e-cigarettes in or on school property. This includes in all District facilities, vehicles, on all District grounds and at all District sponsored events, in accordance with local by-law regulations.

Definitions

Activated e-cigarette is an e-cigarette in which an e-substance is being vapourized.

E-cigarette is a product or device, whether or not it resembles a cigarette, containing an electronic or battery-powered heating element capable of vapourizing an e-substance for inhalation or release into theair; or a prescribed product or device similar in nature or use to a product or device described above.

E-substance is a solid, liquid or gas that on being heated, produces a vapour for use in an e-cigarette, regardless of whether the solid, liquid or gas contains nicotine; and, is not a controlled substance within the meaning of the <u>Controlled Drugs and Substances Act</u>.

Tobacco is tobacco leaves or products produced from tobacco in any form or for any use. **Vapour product** is an e-cigarette e-substance; and/or, a cartridge for, or a component of, an e-cigarette.

1. Procedures

- 1.1. This ban applies to all school District properties, whether or not school is in session. The ban also includes vehicles, parking lots, sports fields, driveways, courtyards and private vehicles parked on school District property.
- 1.2. School District staff will cooperate with health and community agencies that provide smoking prevention and cessation programs.
- 1.3. This administrative procedure does not apply to the ceremonial use of tobacco in or on schoolDistrict property if the ceremonial use of tobacco is approved by the District and it is performed:
 - 1.3.1. In relation to a traditional Aboriginal cultural activity; or,
 - 1.3.2. By a prescribed group for a prescribed purpose, if given the authorization of the principal and in alignment with this administrative procedure.
